COMMEMORATION CEREMONY

September 11, 2026

On the anniversary of 9/11, the families of victims will gather for a ceremony on the 9/11 Memorial plaza to read aloud the names of the 2,983 men, women, and children killed in the September 11, 2001 attacks and February 26, 1993 bombing of the World Trade Center.

TRIBUTE IN LIGHT

September 11, 2026

Tribute in Light, the two beams of light that evoke the memory of the Twin Towers, is a commemorative public art installation first displayed on the six-month anniversary of the 9/11 attacks. Since then, *Tribute in Light* has appeared in the night sky each 9/11 to honor those killed and shine a light on the unbreakable spirit of New York.

9/11 Tribute In Light: Live from Lower Manhattan Beginning at 8 p.m. ET on September 11

Disney and its affiliates, in partnership with the 9/11 Memorial & Museum, will air "9/11 Tribute in Light: Live from Lower Manhattan," a first-of-its-kind broadcast commemorating the 25th anniversary of the attacks. ABC News anchors David Muir, Robin Roberts, and Diane Sawyer will host this prime time event available across ABC, Disney+, Hulu, National Geographic, ABC Owned Television Stations livestreams, and ABC News Live.

Timed to coincide with the iconic Tribute in Light in New York City, the one-hour special will serve as the inspiring and uplifting culmination to the nation's day of remembrance. As lower Manhattan shines once again to honor those killed on 9/11, we will lead families across America in paying tribute, looking forward, and remembering that in darkness, we shine brightest.

For the first time, we partnered with New York Road Runners on our Run to Remember charity race, presented by RXR. This year's race took place on Saturday, July 11 in Central Park, offering a new and inspiring setting for participants to gather in tribute. The updated course became a four-mile (4M) scenic route through the park, creating space for reflection while honoring the 2,977 victims of the September 11, 2001 attacks and recognizing the courage and resilience that followed.
